## From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Friends

The invitation to the Annual General Meeting, from the YSI Board, was sent home during the week. Please note the change of date; it is now being held on Monday, 9th February. We do apologise for this change, especially to people who have already made plans around the original date. We look forward to seeing as many parents as possible at this important meeting.

Some special information sessions for parents are being held during this term. The dates for a High School Information Session and a SATs and Levels Information Session are in the Forthcoming Events section of this newsletter. SATs are tests that pupils in Years 2, 6 and 9 complete which help us monitor the progress of our pupils. More details about each session will be sent home closer to the dates.

This week, a Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) representative visited CCS as part of our application to CIE to be an accredited IGCSE school. This official visit is an important part of the process and was very encouraging. We look forward to further information within the next four to six weeks.

The BBSA Basketball competition starts next Wednesday. If you intend to visit another school to watch your child play, please advise Mr Calhau by writing a note in your child's Pupil Organiser or by leaving a message at the Front Office. Please do this by Tuesday mornings at the latest as we are required to advise other schools in advance.

With the commencement of another term, classes have started new topics in most subjects. Wherever possible, topics are integrated across the curriculum to ensure that links in learning are made and to provide a balance between academic and fun activities. Year 4, for example is focusing on Australia. In addition to the learning about some of the geography and history, including Dreaming stories of the Indigenous people, the pupils enjoyed a quick game of cricket and some vegemite sandwiches on Monday. Please take the time to talk to your child, including those in older classes, about things they have been doing in class. This also helps pupils' learning.

Friends of CCS have included a lot of information in this newsletter to keep you up-to-date with their activities. We are fortunate to have such an enthusiastic group of parents who are willing to give their time to help. If you are able to help at any time, please let us know.

## Sanantana Dharma Orphanage

In 2007, FoCCS decided to fundraise money for the Sanantana Dharma Orphanage in Negara. The orphanage currently has 42 children aged between 11 & 18 years. Through the amazing work of a number of committed westerners and Indonesians these orphans are now receiving proper education, nutrition, health care and clothing. The money also went to pay for the setting up of a vegetable garden. The orphanage is now self sufficient

Carols evening, in raffle ticket sales, reached a wonderful 24 million rp. This was presented to the orphanage and has been used to pave the entire (muddy) area in front of the orphanage buildings and also to set up an extensive vegetable garden, with irrigation and composting facilities. The orphanage is now fully self sufficient in all its vegetable requirements.

In 2008 Canggu Community School raffle ticket sales raised 15 million rp. This was very well received by the orphanage and is now being used to complete their new sleeping dormitory as they had run out of oney to complete this.

On behalf of FoCCS and the Sanantana Dharma Orphanage I would like to thank you for your continued support.

## An update from our Treasurer's desk



### FOCCS FINANCIAL Mid Year REPORT T2

2008/2009 as of 31 December 2008

We are pleased to confirm that the FOCCS cash balance on hand as at 31st December 2008 was **IDR 59,235,135**. The opening FOCCS cash balance carried forward from the prior School year as at 1st July 2008 was IDR 18,946,161, henceforth an increase in funds of IDR 40,288,974 has occurred during Term 1 and Term 2 2008.

This increase is mainly attributable to the following events and activities:

•	Term 1, 2008	
o	Bake Sale Proceeds	IDR 8,753,300
•	Term 2, 2008	
o	Bake Sale Proceeds	IDR 12,919,500
o	Halloween Night Profit	IDR 9,016,500
o	Christmas Carols Profit	IDR 19,977,250

There has also been an inflow of IDR 8,775,081 interest revenue on Non-Refundable Deposits.

The approved expenditure to date with these funds includes Chair Pouches, Wooden Kitchen sets and a flute for CCS (total IDR 3,718,240), plus a donation of IDR 15,000,000 to the Santana Dharma Negara Orphanage. There was a small loss incurred of IDR 562,250 on CCS tea towels.

There are further items currently in action such as a new set of Encyclopedias for CCS.

We would like to thank you all for the support to date and look forward to a fantastic Third Term of events and projects for the benefit of the School and the Community.
