FoCCS Report Visit to Dharma Sanantana Orphanage - Negara



On Saturday 31st January 2009, a group of Friends of Canggu Community School, with their children, went to Negara, West Bali, to visit the Yayasan Dharma Sanantana Orphanage.

We have raised funds for this orphanage at two Christmas Raffles held at CCS, 24 million Rp. in December 2007 and 15 million Rp. 2008.



With this visit we presented the 15 million rupiah donation, and reviewed the orphanage's progress with the vegetable garden we had sponsored last year, and the



state of the new dormitory building's progress.



The vegetable garden appeared to have a good selection of greens, including local Sawi Hijau, Chilli Peppers, Eggplants, Cassava, Papaya, some Sugar Cane plants and local fruit trees. There is no use of pesticides or fertilizers and some instruction on organic growing methods, the benefits of weeding etc. are needed to improve production.

We brought with us some toys, footballs, crayons, books and and CCS keyrings, which the children were thoroughly pleased to receive.



During the visit, the CCS children interacted with the orphans through playing football, playing the drums and singing together. The orphanage has a talented group of bongo drummers who we hope will one day visit our school and share their skills with all the students as they did during our visit!



We were met by Vikki from the "Bali Children Foundation" which oversees the running of the orphanage, their main aim being to see that the children receive an education.



We were shocked to find the lack of basic food! These children need 900kg of rice per month. They add greens from the garden, but don't have the funds to buy meat, fish or other protein.

The Bali Children Foundation rely on donations to assist with daily running costs, such as food, electricity, gas, clothing etc. Their previous sponsor has recently revoked its 2million Rp. monthly sponsorship, which is why they are without food.

We purchased 50kg of rice and some other basics, like cooking oil, which will last less than a week. Clearly there is an urgent need for a food supply sponsor. To meet the needs, these children will need an additional 2 million Rp.per month.

We will continue to help this orphanage through Friends of CCS fund raising.
