From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Friends

Welcome to Term 4, especially our new pupils and their families. It will be a very busy term as we have a number of special events planned to complement the normal educational programme. In addition to the drama and sport that have been highlighted in this newsletter, there will be camps for several classes, SATs tests for pupils in Years 2, 6 and 9, a series of music concerts and some social events. Also, written reports summarising your child's progress will be sent home at the end of this term.

Our preparation for the first Year 10 class is progressing very well, including our application to Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) for accreditation. Last term, Year 8 and 9 pupils completed Subject Interest Forms, which have helped us select the final list of subjects to be offered. Year 9 pupils will receive further information towards the end of next week. This will help them make their subject selection for IGCSE courses, which will start at CCS in August.

The failure of some pupils to wear a suitable helmet correctly when on motorbikes, scooters and bicycles still concerns me. I am aware of two accidents involving members of the CCS community in the last week. Thankfully, no-one was hurt. The potential danger is always present. Please help us keep your child as safe as possible by insisting that she/he wears a helmet at all times. If staff transport your children, they also need to understand the importance of a helmet.

The pupils and staff involved in *Stories in the Dark* have been working hard to prepare for the performances next week. It promises to be a great show. I look forward to seeing at one, perhaps both!

Stories in the Dark

The CCS drama production of *Stories in the Dark*, a play by Australian author Debra Oswald, will be performed to the public by nineteen keen actors from Years 7, 8 and 9 next Thursday (30th April) and Friday (1st May). The performances will commence at 7:30pm. There will also be a performance for schools on Wednesday. Pupils in these year levels not involved in the acting side of the production have taken on major roles in the areas of set design, sound, lighting, back stage, costume and marketing.

Stories in the Dark is a play about two terrified 12-year-old boys who find themselves separated from their families in the unfamiliar streets of a war torn city. Dodging sniper fire and mortar shells they take refuge in a bombed-out house and in the total blackness their bravado crumbles into tears. Into their lives step Anna and her brother Marcus – both older, street smart and scornful of the boys presence. As a way of keeping them quiet, Anna starts to tell the young boys stories that she vaguely remembers from her own childhood.

It is recommended for children from 8 years old and upwards. Entry is free, but we ask that you contact the Front Office to tell us if you are attending so that we can ensure that there are enough seats. Refreshments will be served before the play starts and during the intermission. The total performance time is approximately 90 minutes.

BSSA Cross Country

Congratulations to Taya (6S) and Carmen (4T) for winning their Division races in the 2009 BSSA Cross-country competition on Friday! Eight participating BSSA schools battled it out on the beach in front of Double-six, Seminyak, to prove who had the stamina and will-power to remain strong to the finish line. What was remarkable about Taya and Carmen's wins were that they were generally competing against girls much older than themselves: Taya has just turned 12 (she won the 2.5km 12-14 yrs Girls Division) and Carmen is 9 years old (she won the 2km 9-11 yrs Girls Division). Other stand-out performances were a 3rd place by Carola (Yr 8) in the 12-14 Girls Division, and a 3rd place by Lachlan (Yr 4C) in the 9-11 Boys Division. Well done to the other thirty CCS pupils who competed as well. All showed terrific spirit and determination in their races.

CCS finished first overall for the 9-11 yrs Division, and second overall for the 12-14 yrs Division. An outstanding effort CCS!

On Wednesday, 22nd April, 18 pupils from CCS competed in the 2009 BSSA Multi Sports Competition. The Ten-pin Bowling and Billiards Competitions were held at the Paradiso Centre in Kuta, and the Badminton Competition in the CCS MFH. The CCS Bowling teams achieved 2nd and 3rd place in the 10-12, and 13-14yrs Divisions respectively, and two semi-final placings by Dewa (Yr 8) and Tom (Yr 9) in the individual Billiards competition. Well done to those who participated!

In the Badminton Competition, Nico (Yr 9) played an outstanding game of badminton, showing creativity and composure under pressure to win the 14+ years Mixed Division.

In the final he played last year's winner, from Dyatmika School. Keanu (Yr 4C) was runner-up in the 8-10 Mixed Division, narrowly beaten in a hotly-contested final. Jack (Yr 5W) and Anya (Yr 8) finished equal 3rd in the 8-10 yr division and 11-13 yr division respectively. Throughout the competition, 10 points were awarded for first place in a division, 5 points for second, 3 points for third and 2 points for fourth.
