From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Friends

It is pleasing to announce to the wider community that Canggu Community School is now a Cambridge International Centre, following approval of our application to Cambridge International Examinations (CIE). CIE, a part of Cambridge University, is the world's largest provider of international qualifications for 14-19 year olds. Combined with our recent change to an International School licence, this important development places CCS in a very positive position for the future. It also gives us a great responsibility to keep striving for improvement. As stated in the recent letter to parents advising them of our accreditation by CIE, our commitment to providing a high quality, well-rounded education for pupils of CCS remains strong.

Some very happy but weary staff and pupils returned from the Year 5 and Year 6 camps during the week. The 5:00am start for the Year 6s, for their dolphin watching trip, certainly contributed to the number of people sleeping on the way back to school! Activities at the camps varied, with some linked closely to the curriculum and others designed to develop problem solving and teamwork skills. More detailed reports will be in next week's newsletter. Years 8 and 9 pupils will be away for their camp from Monday to Friday of next week.

Swimming lessons for PE finish this week and the focus on athletics will increase as we prepare pupils for the carnivals to be held later this month. Swimming lessons will resume at the beginning of the next school year.

The After School Swimming activity for Early Years pupils, run by Mrs Armand and Ms Thompson, will continue until the end of the term. Other families wanting to continue lessons or to participate in squad training are encouraged to contact the Canggu Club as some new programmes have just started.

A series of *Sunset Concerts* will commence soon. These concerts give pupils learning musical instruments the opportunity to perform in public and the opportunity to play with other musicians. There will also be a *Battle of the Bands* competition towards the end of the term and this has generated a lot of interest with our older pupils. An update from our Treasurer's desk



FOCCS FINANCIAL REPORT as at 5th May 2009

We are pleased to confirm that the FOCCS cash balance on hand as at 5th May 2009 is IDR 81,495,816. The opening FOCCS cash balance carried forward from the prior School year as at 1st July 2008 was IDR 18,946,161, henceforth an increase in funds of IDR 62,549,655 has occurred year to date.

This increase is mainly attributable to the following events and activities:

There has also been an inflow to date of IDR 26,568,394 interest revenue on Non-Refundable Deposits.

The approved expenditure to date with these funds includes Chair Pouches, Wooden Kitchen sets, one flute and four large fans for CCS (total IDR 8,518,240). An amount of IDR 15,000,000 was donated to the Santana Dharma Negara Orphanage from the Christmas Event proceeds, and a regular contribution of IDR 2,000,000 per month from our bake sale proceeds known as "Bake for Rice" commenced in January 2009.

There are further items currently in action including the recent purchase of a new set of Encyclopedias and several ideas in the pipeline which are targeted for Term 4.
