I am looking forward to welcoming her to CCS and to working with her when she arrives back in Bali.

## IGCSE Subjects Offered at CCS

The final subjects offered to CCS pupils for IGCSE courses is based on indications of interest from pupils and parents that were given during Term 3.

### Compulsory Subjects:

- English (includes English Literature)
- Coordinated Science (includes Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- Global Perspectives
- Mathematics
- Physical Education (choose an IGCSE or non-IGCSE course)
- ICT (a non-IGCSE course)

### Pupils also select from:

- Art and Design
- Business Studies
- Drama
- Environmental Management
- Geography
- Indonesian (Foreign Language)
- Mathematics—Additional
- Music
- Travel and Tourism

### Other languages:

The possibility of teaching other languages such as Dutch, French and Spanish is still being pursued. If offered, they will be taught outside of normal school hours.

Camp activities were challenging but it was awesome at the same time. I learnt how to make lots of new and different things.

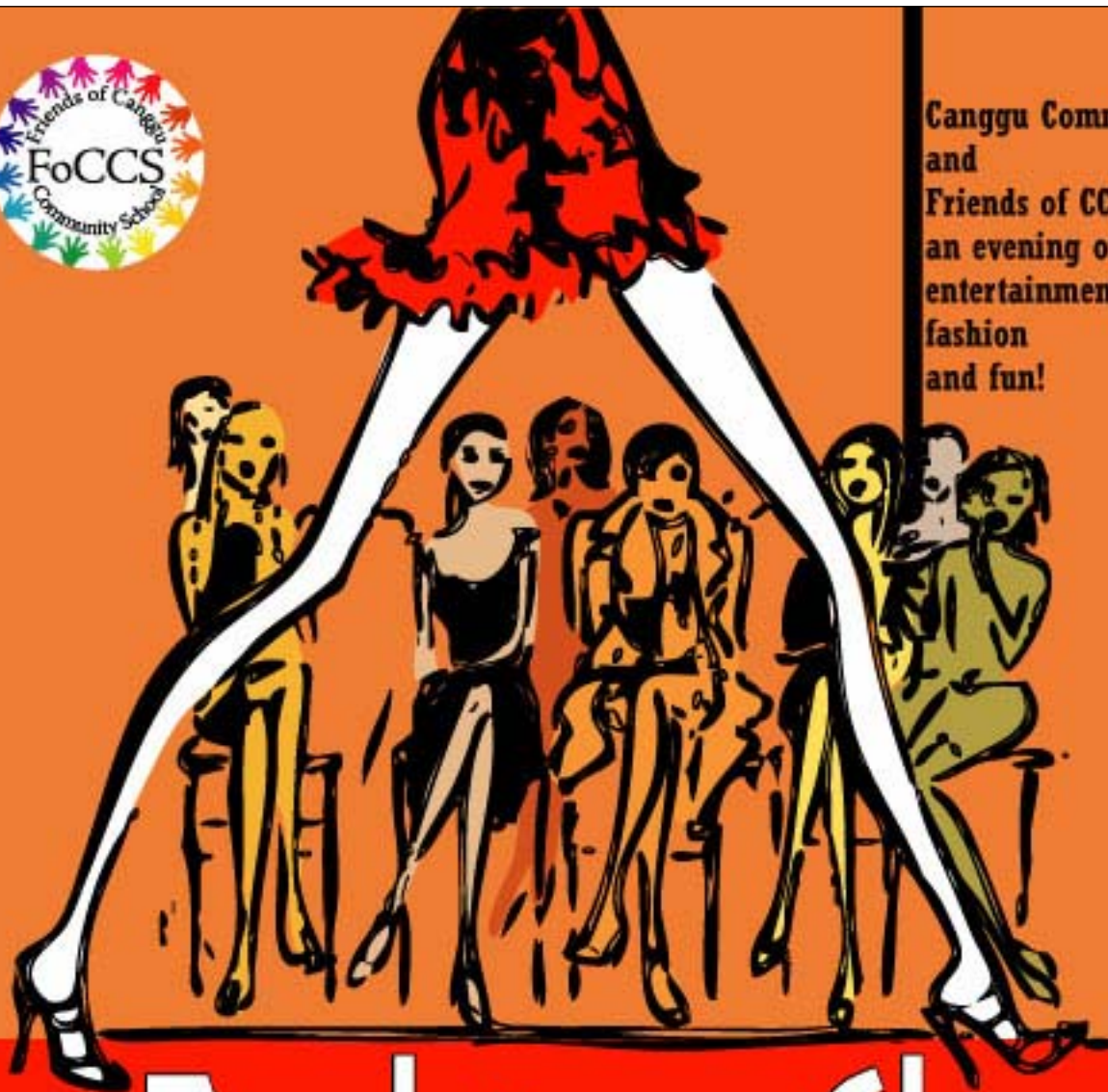
