From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Friends

The Interim Education Board (EB) has been meeting regularly during the last two months. Mrs Kathy Basha, Mr John Blyther, Mr Chris Wootten, Mr Anders (Cookie) Ahman (parent representatives) and Ms Sally Dye (teacher representative) have brought different expertise to the Board. Ms IGA Diah Chandra Dewi (YSI representative) and I have also been involved through our positions within the School. The Constitution has been reviewed, the role of the EB clarified, and a meeting with the YSI held. It has been agreed that greater membership of the EB and sub-committees of people with expertise in particular areas will be established to further assist the School. Years 8 and 9 Camp to East Java

The five-day camp to East Java for Years 8-9 was a huge success! The pupils thoroughly embraced the new experiences and challenges that were offered to them.

We stayed at two locations in East Java – Blawan and Kalibaru.

The highlight at Blawan was the early morning climb of Mt Ijen. Pupils were woken at 5:30am and after a quick breakfast, they were ready to tackle the volcano. The climb took approximately 1 hour 45 minutes. The legs were sore, the smell of rotten eggs (sulphur) was in the air but the view at the crater edge was absolutely amazing! For some pupils it was a hard climb, but they all persisted and were rewarded with a great sense of achievement at the end. Other activities at Blawan included a waterfall trek, a coffee factory tour, cycling, tennis, card games and an evening quiz night.



Kalibaru was quite a different experience. We stayed at the Margo Utomo Hotel that has a dairy farm and a plantation on the premises. After another early morning start the pupils got to milk cows and tour the plantation. For the majority of the pupils, this was their first time milking cows and after a slight hesitation, all were enjoying the new experience. The tour of the plantation was very interactive as they got to taste a lot of the plants that are grown there. Our 'relaxing' time at Kalibaru included a couple of very competitive (but friendly) games of water polo with both teachers and pupils fighting hard for the possession of the ball!



The local pasar in Kalibaru was the location for our "Amazing Race" competition. Teams of three had to purchase specific items and find out information from certain store owners. All instructions and information were written in Bahasa Indonesia and store owners had great delight in purposefully giving teams misleading information!



For our last night, we organised a dance for the pupils. With even numbers of boys and girls, each had to find a partner and invite them to the evening dance. The progressive "Barn Dance" and the Scottish "Strip the Willow" were danced with great energy, enjoyment, enthusiasm and lots of laughter!

Our last day included a stop at Banyuwangi for lunch followed by a becak ride to the traditional pasar. The sight of twenty becaks, all in a line and filled with excited pupils certainly got the attention of the locals.

It is difficult to highlight and sum up the fantastic experiences and challenges that the pupils had by attending this camp. However, one word that was said by the pupils, time and time again was **–AWESOME!!!!** Well done, Years 8 and 9, for a fantastic camp!
