Dear Parents and Friends,

It is a pleasure to welcome you to the new school year, in particular the eleven new pupils and one returning pupil in the Secondary School. There are also three new teachers whose responsibilities are in this section of the school. The new teachers and their main teaching area are: Ms Lilian Barnes (KS 3 and IGCSE Coordinator, English teacher); Mr Paul Moran (Art and Design); and Mr Edwin Owen (Business Studies and ICT). They complement our current team of dedicated teachers very well.

As a growing section of the school, and having just commenced the widely recognised International General Certificate of Education (IGCSE) for our Year 10 pupils, there is a lot to do to ensure that our pupils have the best possible learning experiences as they continue their educational journey at CCS.
