From the Secondary School Desk

Dear Parents and Friends

Thank you parents and pupils for helping the start of the year go so smoothly. Our celebrations for Indonesian Independence Day made the end of the week a little different for everyone. Pupils in Year 7 participated in a Bulleting Board competition and pupils in Years 8 and 9 participated in a quiz about Indonesia. Having so many people dress in red and white, or National dress/batik added to the atmosphere as well.

Sport plays an important part in our week at CCS. Pupils in Years 7 to 9 will experience some cross-training through the PE programme, with one lesson of swimming and one of a land based activity/sport this term. In addition, pupils will participate in House sports each Friday afternoon. Pupils in Year 10 have four lessons of PE. For some, this is an IGCSE subject and it includes practical and theory lessons; for others, it focuses on fitness for fun. There will be a general health component in this course as well.

Pupils in the Secondary School are also being encouraged to participate in interschool sport, through the BSSA competition. Soccer is the sport played this term.

One of the areas we wish to develop in our school is languages other than English. It is important that we give people the opportunity to maintain their mother-tongue and to learn as many languages as possible. We would like to extend the After School Activities programme to include conversational language opportunities for pupils. If you are able to speak a language, other than English, fluently, and you have the time and interest to speak it with some of our pupils, please contact the Front Office. We will then meet with you to discuss the proposal further.

Secondary School pupils are asked to assist us each day by using the top car park as the drop off / collection point each day.

Pupils who come to school on motorbikes, or who ride bicycles to school are reminded that they must wear a helmet. Whilst it is primarily for their safety, it is also important that our eldest pupils are positive role models for those in younger year levels.

Parents, please take the time to ask your child / children what they have done each day. This dialogue is still important in the secondary school years. Positive communication between teachers and parents is also important. To help facilitate this, pupils have an Organiser which you need to read regularly and sign each week. Class and pastoral care teachers will also look at them regularly, but we do expect pupils to take responsibility for communicating when there is a note in it.
