From the Secondary School Desk

Dear Parents and Friends,

Thank you to the parents who attended the Secondary School Information Session on Wednesday of last week. The importance of meeting and getting to know the people who spend so much time with your son/daughter during the day, and developing an understanding of what they are doing and how they are going about it should not be underestimated.

The time to talk about specific subjects, and to learn what will be taught was important. For many of us, the way some things are done now are very different to how we did them when we were at school—and so they should be, with the changes in knowledge, training and technology.

Also of importance, was the opportunity to talk about pastoral care (PC) at CCS. The teenage years can be a difficult time for people, with social and emotional changes occurring as well as the physical. One of the key roles of pastoral care teachers is to get to know your child so they can support them and give constructive advice as necessary. They also have a role in monitoring organisation, academic progress and general behaviour.

PC occurs each day, for twenty minutes, and approximately every third Friday morning during the Assembly time.

One of the focus areas for PC teachers to date has been goal setting. As adults, we generally have goals or targets that we wish to achieve. Pupils need the same. In PC time, teachers have been helping pupils work out what they can improve upon and what they want to achieve. These will be reviewed again during the year, which helps to introduce the concept of reflection.

Parents, please ask your son/daughter about their goals and targets for the year. Discussions such as this help keep you informed and also help young adults clarify their thoughts. And, of course, it helps encourage them to communicate with you!

Last week I had to undergo the pressures of an interview. Not for a job this time, but research for a biography. The Year 6 classes were buzzing with activity last Tuesday. Parents had been invited in to be interviewed to gather information for their biography. I had the honour of being interviewed by Maxmo and Natasha. I was asked pertinent questions like "What is a favourite childhood memory?" and "Where did you work before you came to Bali?" I look forward to my biography being published. Thank you to those parents who were also interviewed. This activity is obviously part of the Year 6 writing programme, but it is also a very important area of our Literacy curriculum: Speaking and Listening. We so often remember the traditional "3 Rs" of Reading, Writing and Arithmetic, and forget the importance of Speaking and Listening. Indeed, it would sometimes seem that one of the most difficult things we learn to do at school is listen!



On Friday Year 3D hosted the Primary School assembly guided by one of our student teachers from Australia, Miss Lisa. I would like to congratulate Miss Lisa: organising an assembly and speaking in front of more than 200 people is a nerve-wracking experience.
