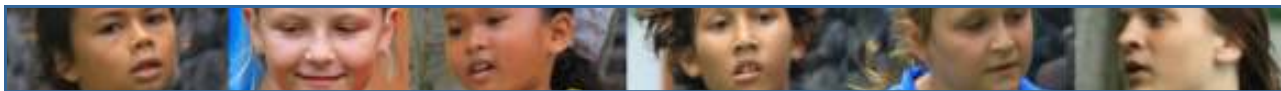

We hope that everyone had a good break, and welcome back to the busy final term of this semester.

Last term ended with the fantastic CCS Idol. Year 10 however missed the event, as we were on a joint Geography / Global Perspectives field trip with Mr Wyndow and a visiting Geographer from Western Australia, Mark Utley.

Our first stop after picking Mark up from the airport, where he had just flown in from Perth, was to head for Uluwatu beach. There we completed a study on the site and situation of the location, the physical and cultural environment and the impact humans have had on the location. The students also completed some impressive annotated field sketches. We then moved to Legian and completed a comparative study on the coast line there.

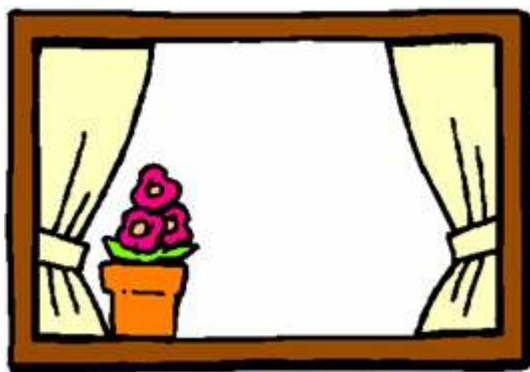
Fieldwork and project work are compulsory components of both the Geography and the Global Perspectives IGCSE courses. We are now using the findings from our fieldwork to write an extended report on sustainability and the impact of tourism on the physical environment of South Bali, which will be sent to Cambridge for assessment.

It was an informative and also fun trip. Thank you to Mark Utley for setting the fieldwork task and study questions, and for his and Mr Wyndow's great input.

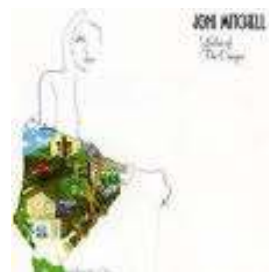


Clues:
