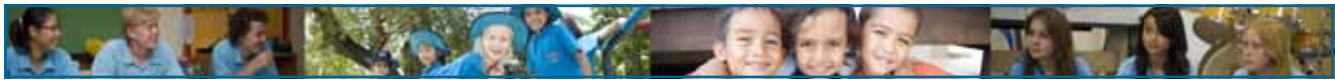

## The Secondary School Maths Challenge



**Solution from Week 2:** Angle  $FAE=20^\circ$

The interior angle of a regular nine-sided polygon

$$180^\circ - (360^\circ \div 9) = 140^\circ.$$

Consider the pentagon  $ABCDE$ :

$$\text{angle } EAB = \frac{1}{2}(540^\circ - 3 \times 140^\circ) = 60^\circ.$$

Similarly, angle  $FAI=60^\circ$  and

$$\text{hence angle } FAE = 140^\circ - (60^\circ + 60^\circ) = 20^\circ.$$

How many of the numbers  $(3 \times \sqrt{11})$ ,  $(4 \times \sqrt{7})$ ,  $(5 \times \sqrt{5})$ ,  
 $(6 \times \sqrt{3})$ ,  $(7 \times \sqrt{2})$  are greater than 10?

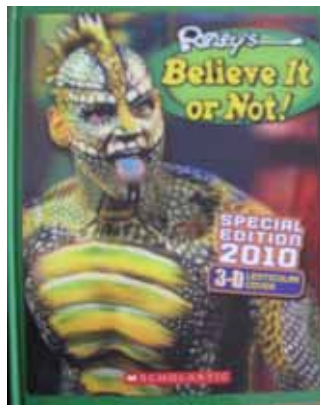
