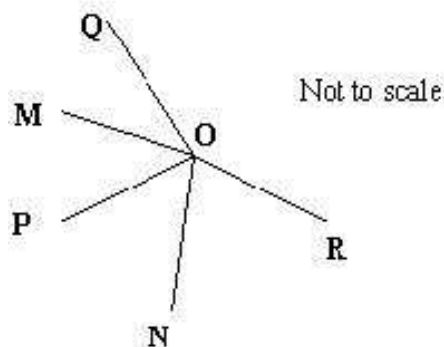
IGCSE Business Studies visit Wooden Ships

We visited a clothing manufacturer called Pt Wooden Ships Clothing. They design and manufacture woolen clothes for the US and European markets. At Wooden Ships we examined how applying lean production techniques has benefited the company.

Firstly, Mark Donovan, the owner, explained how chaotic their production method was before going 'Lean'. But on our visit, we saw a dramatic change in the way they manufacture their products. The 'Lean' approach has reduced lead times from 3 months down to 3 hours! The whole trip was very educational and interesting. We hope to visit there a second time to investigate their marketing techniques and meet the MODELS! A big thank you to Mark for showing us around and taking the time to talk to us.

Guess Who?!

The library theme, Explorers, is going strong for one more week so we're featuring a famous underwater explorer and marine biologist for this week's Guess Who. In recent years she has also become an advocate for underwater research and is an internationally known champion for ocean conservation. Do you know who this Explorer-in-Residence at National Geographic is????

Clues:

- Born August 30, 1935



- She has been at the frontier of deep ocean exploration for four decades. She's led more than 50 undersea expeditions, and she's been an equally tireless advocate for our oceans and the creatures who live in them.
- She, called "Her Deepness" by the *New Yorker* and the *New York Times*, "Living Legend" by the Library of Congress, and the first "Hero for the Planet," is an oceanographer, explorer, author, and lecturer with experience as a field research scientist.
